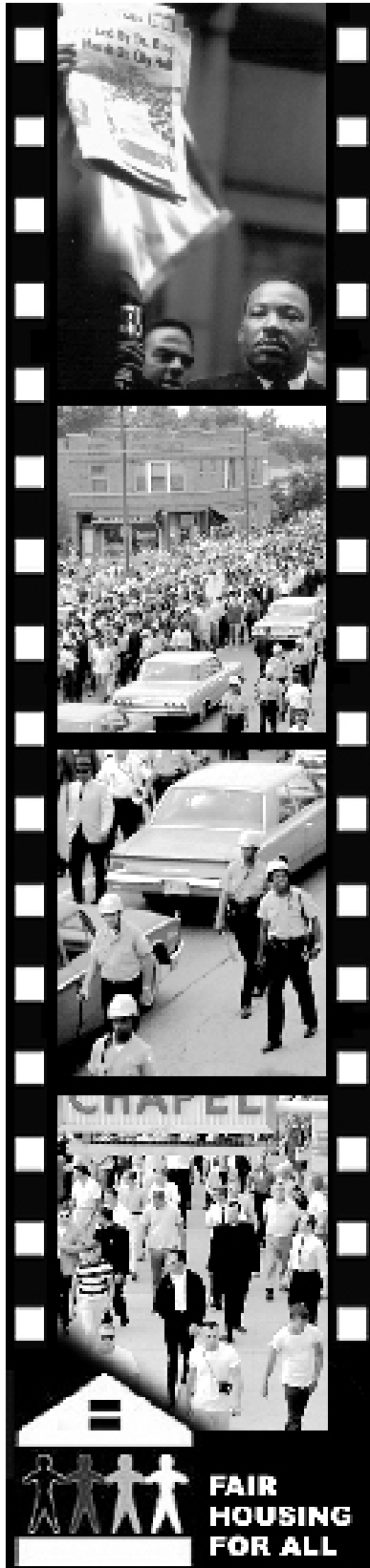

The Chicago Freedom Movement focused on housing segregation, staging regular marches into the city's all-white neighborhoods. The hostile response of white residents and the determination of civil rights activists to continue their open housing crusade attracted the attention of the national press. This exhibit by artist Bernie Kleina chronicles these events, which led directly to the passage in 1968 of the first federal Fair Housing Act and hard-won anti-discrimination laws.
